Administrative questions

I. Introduction

1. In 2023, the Centre's institutional activities on campus have progressively increased to an order of magnitude comparable with the pre-pandemic period. This required the adaptation of all support processes, both in terms of facility maintenance and services for participants.

II. Infrastructure projects

2. In 2023, two additional Memorandum of Understanding have been signed between the Government of the Italian Republic and the International Labour Organization, to respectively fund the construction work on the Americas 2 and Italy pavilions on the Centre's campus

III. Health and Safety

3. OSH routine activities were discussed by the OSH committee on a regular basis and implemented, to maintain the full compliance with the applicable standards.

IV. Security

4. In 2023, no significant internal security issues have been reported. The Centre was in constant contact with the UN Security Management Team - Italy and implemented the recommendations made, also thanks to the excellent collaboration with the Italian intelligence and law enforcement units.

V. Greening the campus as a part of a wider sustainability effort

5. The Centre expanded and implemented its annual action plan concerning eco-sustainability issues. Greenhouse gas (GHG) inventory reports and a waste inventory were produced and submitted to the UNEP / Greening the Blue Initiative. Unavoidable emissions were neutralized by procuring carbon offsets. The annual process for maintaining the Centre's Green Flag status awarded by the Foundation for Environmental Education was successfully completed. The renovated Africa10 pavilion was awarded with the LEED – Gold certification.

VI. On campus activities with local partners

6. Compared to the past, in 2023 the Centre received from local partners a higher number of requests to host activities on campus. Through a more selective approach and considering the increasing number of institutional F2F activities, such requests have been evaluated on the basis of their financial contribution but also of their value in terms of establishing collaborations consistent with the ITCILO mandate.

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
